Colleges and Universities in the Pikes Peak Region

The Pikes Peak region is home to many colleges and universities, both private and state-supported, providing high quality academic and professional programs.

The local population takes full advantage of the opportunities to learn new skills, expand their understanding and prepare for new careers. Many students pursuing advanced study in the Pikes Peak region don't fit the typical "college student" profile. As a result, programs often cater to the needs of adults working full time. "Lifelong learning" characterizes the involvement of the local community with the region's institutions of higher learning.

Colorado ranks fourth among the 50 states in the percentage of citizens with college degrees. As of 2000, over one-third of Coloradoans over age 25 have a degree. Over 30,000 people graduate from Colorado colleges and universities every year.

Beth-El College of Nursing and Health Sciences at UCCS

Beth-El College of Nursing and Health Sciences, founded in 1904, is a college within UCCS offering curriculum leading to undergraduate and graduate degrees in nursing and health science. Beth-El places student nurses in a variety of hospitals, mental health facilities, and other agencies in the region for their clinical learning experiences. Total enrollment is approximately 500 students with 20 full- and 18 part-time faculty.

The bachelor of nursing and health science programs require four academic years to complete. The college offers programs for registered nurses to complete a bachelor's degree with advanced placement. The health science baccalaureate program offers an option in emergency health that will prepare the graduate for professional practice in emergency health services. Beth-El College also offers a program of advanced study in neonatal nursing, adult health nursing and family nursing leading to a master of science degree. MSN courses prepare the graduate for expanded clinical practice roles as clinical specialists or nurse practitioners. The college offers a four-year Bachelor of Science in Nursing degree, a RN to BSN bridge program, and a four-year Bachelor of Science in Health Care Sciences degree with options in Nutrition; Sports, Health and Wellness; Health Care Management; Forensic Health Science and completion degrees in Emergency Medical Services and Radiation Technology. Additionally, Beth-El offers a Masters of Science in Nursing degree with different specialties available and several certificate options for undergraduate and graduate students

UCCS is accredited and approved by the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools. Beth-El is accredited by the National League of Nursing and the Colorado State Board of Nursing.

Colorado Christian University (CCU) was founded in 1914 in Denver. Currently, it operates with campuses in Lakewood, Morrison, Colorado Springs and Grand Junction. CCU offers 25 undergraduate majors and two graduate majors.

The Colorado Springs campus of the university offers an associates degree in Biblical Studies; bachelor of science degrees in Organizational Management (OM) including Human Resources (OMHR) and Christian Leadership (OMCL) as well as Computer Information Systems Management (CISM). The OM and CISM curricula are accelerated degree completion programs designed to meet the needs of the working adult by holding classes one night a week, transferring previous college credit and assessing life experience for college credit. The OM program can be completed in 54 weeks and the CISM program may be completed in 64 weeks. All courses are held seminar style with the focus on interactive learning. CCU also offers Master of Arts degrees in Counseling, Curriculum Instruction and Licensing Program for Educators (LPE).

Colorado Christian University is accredited by the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools and by American Association of Bible Colleges.

Colorado College is a distinctive, independent, co-educational liberal arts college that attracts an international student body, ranked in the top 30 liberal arts in the nation. Established in 1874, the college combines excellent teaching in the arts and sciences with a unique academic calendar called the Block Plan.

The Block Plan divides the academic year into 8-1/2 segments, or "blocks," of 3-1/2 weeks each. Under this plan, students take one principal course at a time and faculties teach only one. This schedule equalizes the importance of all courses and allows students to give full and intense attention to each course they take.

The college enrolls approximately 1,900 students from 50 states and 29 foreign countries. Bachelor's degrees may be earned in 33 fields, including economics, mathematics and political science. Pre-professional programs are offered in the health professions, engineering and law. A Master of Arts in teaching program is available to recent college graduates as well as experienced teachers. The college serves as a cultural resource for the community by offering a wide array of lectures, music and dance performances, dramatic productions and art exhibits. The Colorado College Symposium, a three-day event in January, brings the community and the college together to explore a single topic through multiple perspectives.

The University of Southern Colorado (main campus in Pueblo) provides accelerated degree completion opportunities designed for the working adult. The courses are offered in nine-week terms with five terms per year. Typically, courses are scheduled one or two nights per week, or Friday or Saturday. Some of the more popular offerings are the intensive weekend “mini-courses,” designed for the individuals unable to take the nine-week courses or who wish to add additional credits to their nine-week schedule.

In Colorado Springs, USC currently offers degree programs consisting of the Bachelor of Science in Social Science, Sociology, Sociology/Criminology, Social Work, and Business are presently available, as well as some lower division general education courses.

Courses are currently held at five convenient locations in the city including at our Citadel Center, Pikes Peak Community College, Fort Carson, and Peterson Air Force Base and are open to all members of the Colorado Springs community. USC is accredited by the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools.

Pikes Peak Community College (PPCC) is a comprehensive two-year college that offers associate's degrees and certificates in nearly 100 programs. Programs provide freshman- and sophomore-level college courses for transfer to four-year colleges and universities, occupational training for employment in technical and vocational fields, courses to upgrade present occupation skills, courses for personal growth and remedial instruction.

PPCC has several locations including the Centennial Campus, the Downtown Studio, the Rampart Campus, Commerce Center, and Woodland Park, Cripple Creek/Victor and Elizabeth centers. Classes are also offered at local military bases and at the Colorado Springs Senior Center. Business and industry training is provided by Corporate, Workforce and Economic Development (CWED), a division of PPCC.

PPCC offers specialized education and customized training programs for local businesses and industry. In response to the needs of local businesses, for example, PPCC created the Integrated Circuit Fabrication Institute. This program prepares students for careers in microelectronics. Programs in Customer Service Technology, Machining Technology, Welding Technology and Office Information Technology were also developed to serve the needs of local employers.

Since 1991, the Commerce Center facility of PPCC has provided corporate education and training to 35,000 individuals employed by 150 local companies. The first of its kind in the nation, Commerce Center was designed through the cooperative efforts of local business and industry, and PPCC.

PPCC is accredited by the Commission on Institutions of Higher Education of the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools, Colorado State Board of Nursing and American Dental Assistants Association.

Regis University is a Jesuit institution founded in Denver in 1887, now with seven different campuses. Both Colorado Springs campuses, at Campus Drive and Peterson Field AFB, are for students over the age of 23 who possess significant college, work or life experience. Many classes are held at night and on weekends to better accommodate the students' work schedules. Online courses are also available. This accelerated program divides its academic year into five-week and eight-week terms, allowing students to progress as rapidly as desired.

The Colorado Springs campus offers Professional Studies with 10+ undergraduate majors, Masters of Business Administration, Masters of Science in Computer Information Systems and Masters of Science in Management

United States Air Force Academy

The U.S. Air Force Academy traces its history to 1954 when President Eisenhower signed legislation authorizing its creation. The Pikes Peak region was chosen for many reasons including abundant land, good flying weather and a supportive community.

Cadets are admitted by appointment. Only 10 percent of applicants are admitted. Cadets complete four years of studies leading to a Bachelor of Science degree. Emphasis is given to academics, military training, athletic conditioning and spiritual and ethical development. Academics include classes in the basic sciences, engineering, the humanities and the social sciences. Cadets can specialize in any of 31 academic majors. Graduates incur an active duty commitment of five years more, after completion of flight training.



University of Colorado at Colorado Springs (UCCS)

One of four campuses in the University of Colorado system, UCCS was founded in 1965 and is prepared to meet the higher education demands of the community for the 21st century. The university offers undergraduate degrees in college of Letters, Arts and Sciences; Business; Engineering and Applied Science; and Nursing and Health Science; as well as pre-professional degrees in medicine and related disciplines. Numerous graduate degrees are also offered, as well as PhDs in Computer Science and Electrical Engineering.

Located on 420 acres in north-central Colorado Springs, the campus is developed on about 90 acres. Modern residence halls house approximately 600 students. The \$28 million El Pomar Center, which includes the Kraemer Family Library, adds seating for 1,300, a television studio, media center, teleconferencing rooms, students multimedia development facilities, computing services and computer labs, and high-speed Internet connections.

This is a new and exciting time as UCCS rolls out a unique new "family" of degrees. Like a Bachelor of Science (BS) or Bachelor of Arts (BA), the BI is not a single degree but a family of related majors, including BI in Business Administration, BI in Computer Science, BI In Computer Science: Security, BI in Electrical Engineering and BI in Game Design And Development. The BI has a major field of study, just like a BA or BS, but it also has a common core in innovation and entrepreneurship including a unique long-term multi-disciplinary team experience. It is a Bachelor's degree, from an accredited university, and the initial demand as measured by a survey of Colorado companies show the BI students will have a significant advantage in the market.

The university boasts one of a select number of accredited business colleges nationally whose undergraduates and graduate students are exposed to an international curriculum. A state-of-the-art engineering building features some of the best laboratory facilities in the region, including a clean room for microelectronics research, a VSLI design lab, CAD lab, and Communications and Signal Processing lab. The university's anechoic chamber is used to study microwave systems.

Traditional classroom instruction is supplemented by a variety of options including CU-Net, an interactive instructional television network that broadcasts courses to homes or businesses in the community. MBA and MPA programs taught by UCCS faculty are broadcast internationally by Mind Extension University. The university also offers extensive continuing education programs and an active ROTC program that has been nationally recognized for its outstanding officers and cadets.

The Gallery of Contemporary Art is also housed on the campus and features exhibits as well as special programs for the education and enjoyment of the Colorado Springs community. Courses are offered at Ft. Carson, Peterson AFB and the U.S. Air Force Academy at the invitation of military officials. A full range of student services are provided through the local field office. Courses are scheduled on a weekend format to accommodate the working adult. UNC faculty and occasionally select graduate lecturers from other higher education institutions, public school systems, education service agencies and appropriate professional organizations teach the courses. UNC is a member of and accredited by North Central Association of Colleges and Schools.

The Colorado Springs campus of the University of Phoenix offers evening classes specifically designed for working adults in pursuit of undergraduate or graduate degrees. The concentrated-study courses meet one night a week for five- or six-week sessions. Students generally take only one course at a time. The University of Phoenix offers bachelor's and master's degrees in Business, Criminal Justice, Education, Human Services, Nursing/Healthcare and Technology

The University of Phoenix enrolls adults who are employed full time. The faculty are practicing professionals who teach in the evenings. The curriculum emphasizes the development of leadership and interpersonal skills through small class environments and study groups. The University of Phoenix is accredited by the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools.

The graduate programs at Webster University in Colorado Springs are designed for early- and mid-career professionals who require a strong academic background with built-in flexibility to accommodate busy schedules. The educational programs offered by Webster build on existing talents and skills and provide professional development and academic credentials for advancement in a present career, a successful change of career or the launching of a new career. Webster University offers master's degree programs in Business, Management, Human Resources Development, Computer Resources and Information Management, Procurement and Acquisitions Management, and Space Systems Management. These are 36 semester-hour courses of study. A 39 semester-hour masters of science in Space Operations is also offered.

Webster University also offers a Master of Business Administration (MBA), which is designed for students who want a quantitative orientation to their graduate work at the master's level. It consists of 21 hours of the MBA curriculum, an area of emphasis and electives for a total of 48 hours unless pre-requisite courses must be taken.

The graduate programs at Webster are open to all eligible military and civilian personnel. Nine-week semesters begin in January, March, June, August and October. New students may begin their programs at any of these times. Courses usually meet one evening per week for four hours. Classes are held at the Center for Graduate and Professional Studies in northern Colorado Springs and at the Peterson Air Force Base Education Center.
