Emphasis:

Children's School (Pre-K – 5): Students of all ages learn reading, writing, and mathematics - as well as science and social studies. We are especially proud of our fine arts program, where students exhibit tremendous skill and poise in creating and performing. Children begin studying Spanish in PreKindergarten, have regular learning times in our beautiful library, go to physical education three times a week, and have ample opportunities to practice technology.

Middle School (6 – 8): Provide an active, "hands-on" environment in which our students thrive while meeting rigorous academic challenge. A wide variety of courses cover the basic disciplines and we offer a full complement of pre-preparatory subjects. These include math (through nonlinear algebra), English, science, social studies, foreign language (Spanish and French), honors courses, and classes in the fine arts and information technology. The academic day consists of eight periods, each lasting 45 minutes.

Upper School (9 – 12): Academic courses in the Upper School are challenging and offer our students the opportunity to delve deeply into a wide variety of subjects. We place an emphasis on helping students develop the inquiry, analytical, documentation, and presentation skills they will need in competitive college environments. An experiential approach combined with small group, large group, and individualized student-teacher interactions provide CSS students with numerous opportunities to further develop critical thinking and problem-solving skills in all subjects. Our goal is to prepare our students so they can form and defend their own opinions and are well prepared for college-level work, which includes term papers, special projects, and test taking. In order to maximize our course offerings while maintaining a smaller personal community, we offer some of our classes on a block system, which enables students taking 90-minute courses to earn full-year credits in just half a year. These longer blocks also provide adequate time for in-depth discussion, field experiences, and lab work.
