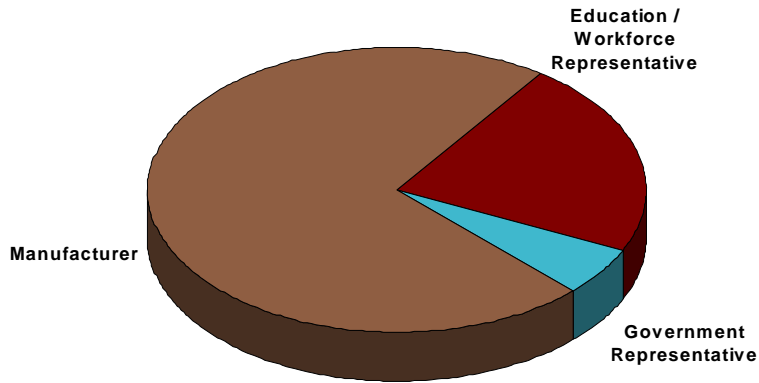

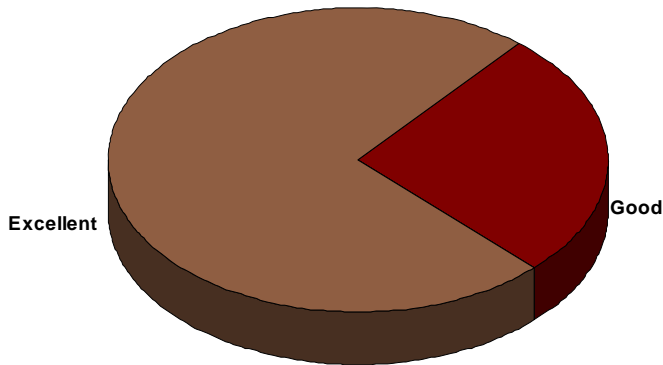

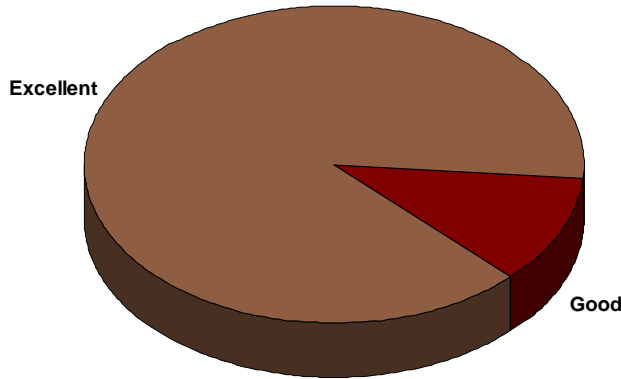
**Comments:**

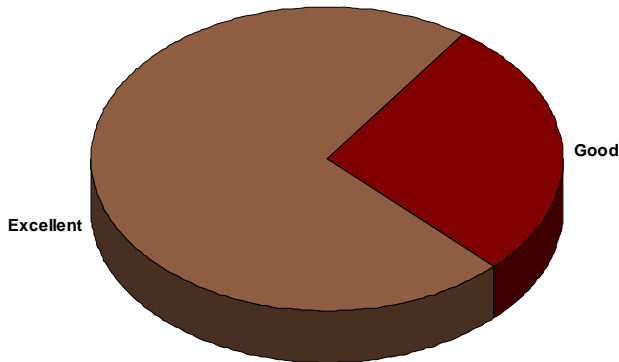
Glad to hear the news, but the message came across a little confused, i.e. which college will be responsible for what - there is a lot of overlap.

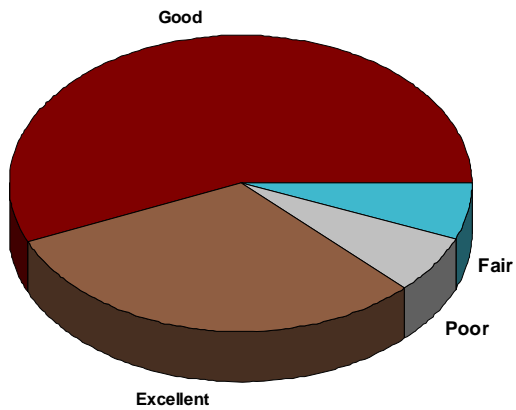
Didn't seem like the instructor in the PPCC machining area was well versed in machining.
